Summary Description:

The Clover Hill Farm duplex quarter is a stone, one and one-half-story, side-gable roofed building, measuring @20' 2" by 16' 2". It was originally two rooms in plan (the partition has been removed), heated by end chimneys, and each accessed via an exterior doorway. One window for each room located in the rear facade, and single windows in each gable serve the unheated attic. Currently the attic is accessed via an opening using a moveable ladder in what had been Room 2. The entire roof frame and all but three ceiling joists have been replaced, the rafters and sheathing boards with old lumber salvaged from a nearby barn. The floor is concrete; the frames for the doorways and for the first floor windows, as well as the doors, have been replaced. Nail evidence and a ghost on the third ceiling joist from the east suggests the location of a header for the original stair; if so, it is likely that the partition was attached to the next joist (replaced). This would have divided the space into two rooms, with the room with the stair slightly larger in dimension. The access to the space via a stair suggests that the attic was used in some capacity, but it is unheated and the current gable windows are likely to be a later change.

The building was moved from the Clover Hill farm complex to its current location, east of the Methodist church.


