Summary Description:

The Glendale Kitchen-Quarter is a brick, side-gable-roofed duplex structure, with end chimneys, one and one-half stories in height, measuring @32'9" by 18'1". It is located roughly 26 feet to the northwest of the main house, which was built circa 1847-50. The walls are laid in 5:1 common bond, with a corbelled cornice, and jack arches above all of the openings; the relatively low-pitched gable roof is covered with standing-seam sheet metal. The symmetrical four-bay façade features two centered doorways flanked on either side by a single window; two windows are in the rear wall. Two windows flank the chimney in the west gable; a single window is positioned to the north of the chimney on the east.

The two first-floor rooms are almost equal in size, each with a doorway and window on the façade and a window in the rear, with plastered walls and exposed ceiling joists. A doorway in the brick partition allows direct access between the rooms; an enclosed staircase is positioned in the NE corner of the west room leading to the room above. The two rooms in the half-story match those below in size; a doorway in the partition allows access to the east room. In both rooms the ceilings are covered with tongue-and-grooved boards and the partition and knee walls are plastered. The first-floor rooms seem to have served non-domestic functions: the substantial fireplace (7'7½") centered on the end wall of the west room likely indicates its use as a kitchen; given the direct access between the spaces the east room may have served as a laundry. The east room on the first floor was heated via a stove connected to a flue centered on the end wall; the two upstairs rooms also likely had been heated by stoves (stove hole in east room; west chimney rebuilt).

The building is remarkably unaltered, with the original floorplan, stairs, and interior fittings. In 2013 the structure underwent modest repairs, which included selectively repointing the wall exteriors and rebuilding the upper portion of the west chimney stack, and replacing the west gable rake boards.


